

THE TROOPS OF DOOM SEPULTURA Ex-Guitarrist Jairo "Tormentor" Guedz's band.

The band THE TROOPS OF DOOM was formed in 2020, during the pandemic, by the original SEPULTURA guitarist Jairo "Tormentor" Guedz.

He recorded the albums "Bestial Devastation" (1985) and "Morbid Visions" (1986). Jairo left the band in 1987, making way for Andreas Kisser, who continues with the band to this day.

THE TROOPS OF DOOM's lineup also includes other significant figures from the Brazilian metal scene, such as guitarist Marcelo Vasco (Patria, Mysteriis), a globally renowned graphic artist known for his work with bands like Slayer, Dee Snid-

er, Kreator, Machine Head, Soulfly, and many others.

The vocalist and bassist Alex Kafer, former live guitarist for

Matanza, and drummer Alexandre Oliveira, a former member of the band Tianastácia, complete the lineup.

The album cover art was painted by the great Sérgio Oliveira, the artist behind the original cover of the classic "Bestial Devastation" from 1985.

Sepultura is almost always mentioned when talking about 'The Troops of Doom'. Do you see this as a good thing or a bad thing?

Jairo T: Thank you for the interview my dear!

I am sure that we are always very proud of it. It is not a comparisson but a respectfully way of understand that I am a part of the old Sepultura as well.

This music and influencies is a part of my DNA, so, the relation between these two bands will be always a truth and a part of this process.

How was 'The Troops of Doom' born and how did it took shape?

Me and Alex are friends for a long time, since the early days with Sepultura in Belo Horizonte. I met him in 2019 for a gig in Rio and his last band was opening act for my band at the time (The Mist) and he asked me to play one of my old songs with his band on the stage, so we did the Bestial Devastation song.

After that show we talked about putting a new band together and that's it !!! I became very happy and impressive with his voice on



the stage, he reminded me of Max in the old times, so we called Marcelo Vasco for the second guitar (Marcelo and Aex had a project together before) and Alexandre Oliveira for the drums... that's how we fix the band in 2020.

What topics do you address in your lyrics, who is in charge of writing them and who composes the music?

Me, Alex and Marcelo write the lyrics always. We talk about religion and how this institution takes place in the political environment since the beginning.

Human being issues such as angry, death, wars, everything...is a part of our subjects also.

What does each member bring to the sound of 'The Troops of Doom'?

I think that this is the magic that I was looking for...we have the same influences that we had in the early 80s and 90s.

So, when me and Marcelo start to work in a new idea, we automatically write something that could perfecty be a song from those times.

We keep the same love for the same bands from the 80s and 90s.

So, every process that surrounds the music (lyrics/merchandising/marketing/cover art, etc) comes naturally after that.





Your music is fast, brutal and loud. What other adjectives would you use to describe it?

Our music is a presentation of the truth that we live, a revelation of what we go through in this world, being insistently massacred by political and religious power, it is a kind of escape-valve for all this suffering and accumulated hatred. For us, and for our fans, it is a therapy hehehehe

> What is the feedback you have received from your fans?

All the feedback we have received so far has being very positive. Critics and fans say how this album brings a language more specific to the band, like a signature, and that this is just the beginning of a long journey.

WHAT THE SONG ABOUT)

Since February of 2022, while working on the Music Releases article for Issue No. 19, I was impressed with the album 'Lights On' by the New York trio Sanhedrin.

The force they throw at you with their powerful music immediately reminded me of heavyweight and classic bands like Queensrÿche but, above all, it gave me the same feeling as the music of another Rock trio, one of my very favorites, the Canadian band Rush.

I know that the style and virtuosity of the musicians is not very similar. They are totally different musical approaches.



Perhaps their lyrics do not speak of the same themes or with the same intentions, but the strength, the drive of their interpretations is so similar, in my opinion, that I couldn't help but love them from the very first song I heard of them: Lost at Sea.

The track left a deep mark that, still years later, I keep coming back to it, if not daily, then every third day. The song reminds me of the intensity and musical genius of Rush's 'Hemispheres' album.

Once again, the musical progressions, the lyrics and the legendary and brilliant virtuosity of a band of Rush's caliber do not resemble a more recent, albeit very good band like Sanhedrin.

We all know the importance and size of the Canadian giants, and I'm not trying to belittle them, but rather to make it clear that the Brooklyn band brings the same Rock ingredients to the stage and that their music is rightly filled with the influence of years and years of the best Hard Rock and Heavy Metal legacy.





Sanhedrin may not even list Rush among their favorite or influential bands, but if you've ever listened to 'Tom Sawyer' at full volume, played '2112' on a loop all afternoon, or used to drive down the street blasting 'La Villa Strangiato' or 'YYZ' out of the speakers of your vehicle, that same feeling is the one that brings forth, at least for me, Sanhedrin, throughout the whole 'Lights On' Album, but especially in the 'Lost at Sea' track.



The lyrics to Rush's songs, as we all know, were mostly written by the dearly-missed 'Professor', Neil Peart. His lyrics address deep themes and higher concepts. They are the kind of song lyrics that are a true pleasure to read and you learn something new by understanding them.

Rush never used superficial lyrics or fell into the cliché. Despite this, they were able to bring the complexity of progressive music to the general public, without compromising their compositions or style in the process.





In the same way, Sanhedrin manages to tell us an interesting and deep argument, well thought out and measured.

They give us their point of view of the individual, society and give us food for thought, with phenomenal riffs and musical arrangements in the background.

'Lost at Sea' evokes the epic, the transcendental, the infinite depths and possibilities of the seven seas, and yet, That's Not What the Song is About!

What was the reaction of your friends and family when they found out about your venture into the adult entertainment industry?

My family and friends have been so supportive and proud of me. Sure, there are friends, especially really religious ones, that are praying for my soul not overall the people I truly care about are happy that I've found such success and purpose.

Was it an act of rebellion or were you taking a stand? What were the main reasons for switching from conventional and mainstream acting to the adult industry?

If you read my book, you'll see that this was a long, thoughtout process for me that took many years of self-reflection and

self-discovery to get to a place where I wanted to perform. But once I got into it I was so comfortable and it came so naturally. I was good at it. To say it is an act of rebellion is such a short-sighted look at what I've done and it's one that people who judge love to use. As if finding my authentic self was in some way getting back at the world (and not meets world fame) is ridiculous. I was finally embracing the world that I created for myself.

Acting is acting. A producer friend told me that. On whatever I do I am an actress and to differentiate it as being mainstream acting or porn is making what I do other than. It's not. That's also a way people try to compartmentalize pornography for the larger world. By saying it's taboo and not as merited.

Taking that big turn in

your career was undoubtedly very controversial, but what was the most difficult thing to face?

None of it was difficult to face. It was surprisingly so positive. When it went all over the press, beating Bernie Sanders' heart attack on google searches, it was shocking but positive for the most part. I've had so much love, success and accomplishments in this business, why would that be difficult to face?

What was the first thing that "caught your eye" or made you want to get into the adult industry and at what age?

Exploring my sexuality wasn't something I was comfortable with when I was young and it wasn't until my mid 30s that I started to see myself as a sexual being and then as

a sexual performer. I was creating my own content for a year and half before I ever started making feature films in professional porn. It was a long journey.

What do you like the most about being an adult actress?

The freedom to express myself, the scripts and acting I get to do that Hollywood held me back from, the success and accomplishment I feel.

This Carter is on my terms and much of my young life in Hollywood wasn't.

Was it difficult filming your first scene?

Not at all. In fact, my costar later said how surprised he was that I wasn't nervous at all. It all came so naturally and I felt so empowered and free.







Do you think that sex-related work is a relaxed and comfortable way to earn a living or is it not as easy as it seems?

It's a lot of hard work to film the features we do. Always 12–14-hour days.

The sex is actually the least of it as there are such lengthy scripts and shots we need to get. It's a fun business but it isn't easy work at all.

You have to be extremely physically fit to do this and know how to perform a very intimate act for the cameras. Girls think they can fine on and immediately get popular and rich but it takes a lot of brand building.

In your own opinion, how have you evolved from that first adult scene to this moment, as an artist?

I'm comfortable in my sexuality and performance. I've evolved as a human, not just a performer. I always look for new challenges to inspire me.

What do fans ask you the most on social media or when they see you on the street?

I can always tell when they give me "the look" like I know exactly who you are but I don't know if I should say.

They usually end up ask-

> ing something about Boy Meets World. It's a good ice breaker.

What disadvantages do you find in porn and what would you change about the industry?

While I think it's hard for the average performer to be heard and validated by a world still very afraid of what the world of porn is, I think a lot of performers suffocate under that. They play into those stereotypes and validate what others think. When I hear girls say "it's only porn" it makes me angry.

They aren't taking themselves or the work seriously enough and that feeds into taboos and stereotypes. Don't ever make what you do less than.

What are your goals within the adult industry?

I don't focus my goals just on the adult industry because I think that's limits the industry itself.

I hope to bring recognition and a broader world that still harbors ideas of porn that are outdated.

They think it's all Ron Jeremy orgies when so much has changed.

Normalizing porn to a world who watches it but is still afraid to admit it is essential.

How do you see the future of the adult industry in terms of technological progress and user behavior?

Ever since Only Fans, adult actresses have become increasingly independent of large productions.

Onlyfans has been so good for performers to take the power into their hands.

No longer studios are the dictators of success. That being said, I enjoy the full production of porn films.

I love doing all my content for onlyfans, it's so much fun, but I also want to bring legitimized adult filmmaking to the broader world. But onlyfans and content creation

have truly brought the power to the performer.

What are the most important lessons you have learned in your career?


To be my authentic self and embrace that.

Get a following on social media first. That's always a stepping stone to get companies to hire you. And build your onlyfans from that.


If I was freshly starting out I'd want an established agent behind me to guide me through the pitfalls of the business and build my career effectively.

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

In the Beginning...


Born Frank Frazzetta on February 9, 1928, in Brooklyn, New York, he dropped a 'Z' from his last name for aesthetic reasons early in his career.

As a child, he spent a lot of time in the company of his grandmother, who always encouraged him to continue improving, even at the tender age of two. It is said that his grandmother gave him a penny for each completed drawing.



Since he was little, he surprised everyone with his great talent. Even when he entered art classes, his teachers were shocked, making it difficult for him to learn anything new from them.

At the age of 16, in 1944, he began working in the studio of Bernard Baily, a comics artist, making pencil clean-ups. In those days, it was not customary to include the full credits in the comics, so it is difficult to keep track of all his early solo and cooperative works.







The comic industry was discovering Frazetta's incredible talent, which opened doors to work with various publishers and production companies such as Standard Comics, Famous Funnies, United Artists, Warren Publishing, etc. In this way, he began to also do movie posters and other works.











Frank Frazetta was inducted into the Will Eisner Comic Book Hall of Fame in 1995, the Jack Kirby Hall of Fame in 1999, and The Society of Illustrators Hall of Fame in 1998. In 2001, he was awarded the Life Achievement Award by the World Fantasy Convention. In 2014, Frazetta was inducted into the Science Fiction Hall of Fame and in 2016 into the Album Cover Hall of Fame.














Already in his old age, he had health problems, mainly due to a thyroid condition that went untreated for many years.

After a series of strokes, his right arm was almost completely paralyzed. In order to continue doing what he so loved, Frazetta taught himself to draw and paint with his left hand and thus he was able to continue working.
















There has been much speculation about 'Longlegs', Nicolas Cage's new film. Many critics even compare it to 'The Silence of the Lambs'. Perhaps this is due to the similarity between Clarice Starling (Jodie Foster) and Lee Harker (Maika Monroe) being a rookie FBI agent on the trail of a serial killer who is behind the deaths of 10 families over a 30-year period, in which the main character has managed to evade justice.

As the case progresses, Harker uncovers evidence that points to satanic and occult practices, in addition to realizing that she could have a connection with the murderer, she must race against the clock to stop him and prevent the deaths of another innocent family.

Set in the 90s with a gloomy and terrifying atmosphere, 'Longlegs' is that type of horror that does not use jump scares to impress you, but what I can assure you is that you will find unpleasant and uncomfortable things to see, starting with Nicolas Cage himself performing like a fish in water when playing 'Longlegs'.







Another thing that I loved is how the entire time they were careful not to show the face and appearance of 'Longlegs', there is even a trailer that shows how the protagonist's heart rate rises alarmingly the first time she sees Nicolas Cage in character.

'Longlegs' from the beginning has had a long and enigmatic marketing campaign that is quite unusual.

The first trailers did not say the name of the film, they only showed scenes of violent crimes accompanied by mysterious images, strange coded messages that left you even more confused than before.

Within those strange details that are shown to us, there is also a website where you can see detailed information about the crimes with quite macabre photos, a number was also published that you can dial and you guessed it... 'Longlegs' is on the other side of the line, ready to answer you. Would you dare to call?






Developed by the Chinese studio 'Game Science', founded in 2014, 'Black Myth: Wukong' comes full-handed, although its development began in 2018, it was announced and shown for the first time in 2020, drawing the attention of many players.

This is a game that promises to be positioned among the most important releases of this year, and is ready to release on August 20 for PS5, Xbox, Series X/S and PC.

This is a third-person action-adventure RPG, and although the title shows clear Soulslike influences, you can rest assured, since the developers have said that it is NOT.



Within the game we will personify the Monkey King, Sun Wukong, a predestined one, who undertakes a journey full of magic and intense combat in search of the truth behind a glorious legend from the past.

Black Myth: Wukong, will maintain its own playable identity with a fast and aggressive fighting system, it promises to be a challenging game where, by defeating enemies, our hero will be able to temporarily transform into them and use their abilities for future confrontations, for example, a huge and powerful wolf, who uses a fiery sword, or a wormman, who uses poisonous attacks.

He also has the ability to clone himself and thus attack his opponents.

As you make progress, you will be able to unlock new movements and be able to customize the character to your liking.



Always fighting with the magic staff that changes size in real time as we perform combos and other actions, there is a normal attack and a heavy one, and we can change at any time between three combat postures: normal attack, defense and rush attack, each posture offering different attacks and defenses, as well as spells and fighting styles, its stimulating and deep confrontations will definitely make you sweat.


Something very cool is the enormous number of bosses in the game, which are designed and set in a dark and somewhat terrifying way.
