



Is there anything you miss about 80s - 90s music?


The touring rock and roll lifestyle, sometimes. Women, Drugs, booze, and no responsibilities.


I wouldn't trade what I have now for anything, but I do miss it sometimes.


I also miss selling actual physical product.

Can you tell us some funny anecdotes from back in the day? What was it like doing tours back then?

Tours were a blast back in the day. Especially opening for bigger bands. I remember on our first European tour with Megadeth, my birthday in the UK, MegaDave wanted to party with me for my B-day, but it was 2:00 am in the morning and nothing was open. So, we broke into the hotel bar and had cornflakes and Cognak, because we could not find milk. I have only been that drunk a couple times since then.

How would you describe the current line-up, individually and as a whole?

Current lineup, most professional musicians I've ever played and written with. I think it has a lot to do with the experience and humility, but a topnotch team all the way around.

Do you have any superstitions or rituals before going on stage or in the studio?

I like to fist bump the band before going on stage, it gives us a feeling of unity and oneness that works very well. "I'Am The Weapon" is a very well thought out and worked album and the attention to detail of each of its songs is noticeable and very appreciated. How was the creation process and who is in charge of lyrics, music, riffs, arrangements, etc.?

The normal system is, Mike and Steve and Bill, come up with the main riffs and structure of the songs, I come up with the first draft of lyrics, and Ken perfects what we do. Changes the choruses some music parts sometimes, and sometimes he just writes the whole song.

As a band, whose opinion do you consider most important when you finish writing a song?

Mine of course. But I've learned to listen to, and try the other guy's input, because they are right more than not.

What projects and plans do you have for the rest of the year?
Tours, Videos, Festivals? What's up?

We are working on a few things. Nothing set in stone yet, but many exciting possibilities. We have a new management team, which is giving us more time to come up with ideas and learn some songs we haven't played in a while for live shows.

What is your opinion about the current Rock scene, and the new bands that are coming out?

New bands just starting do not have a prayer. The industry is so different, and so diluted, you really have to love what you do, because there is no real payback. Over 100,000 new songs a day are released on the internet. How do you navigate that??

Some say there are no new Rock and Metal superstars anymore, what do you think will happen; when the old bands, like Iron Maiden and Metallica retire?

The end of an era. Who knows what will be next? Al does it all?

The new album 'Light 'Em Up' is Hard Rock with handfuls of Rock 'n' Roll and a modern depiction of traditional blues at its finest. This is an album full of classic influences and dynamic rhythms, composed of nine original songs and one cover.

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Born in Amelia County in 1946, southwest of Richmond, Virginia, in an area sparsely inhabited and dedicated mainly to hunting and fishing.

The beautiful Monica Kennedy, a lightskinned African-American girl, stood out for her ruthless way of flirting with the peasants.

In a society and a family that considered sex a sin, poor Monica couldn't even send her boyfriend off with a kiss on the cheek without being labeled a harlot.





Despite her strict and very guarded upbringing, through magazines she was able to get to know the world of Hollywood stars, her favorites being the blondes and sensual Jean Harlow and Veronica Lake.

At 16, she left her home and got a job in Boston, until she was able to get into the Boston School of Modeling, which opened the doors to her new life in modeling.

She married a young Greek man named Stelios, but he was immediately deported for entering the country illegally, and Monica was devastated.



Trying to start over, she moved to New York, where she got a job as a go-go dancer, wearing a self-made cowgirl outfit to look more revealing and decorated.

She was getting bigger and bigger audiences and around '63 she was dancing at the Pep-

permint Lounge, which was the hottest place in town.

Doing her stage number between the sets of bands and artists like the Beach Boys, the Ronettes, Liza Minnelli and the Four Seasons.







She was also hired to do a cage dance on The Clay Cole Show, which featured guests of the caliber of The Rolling Stones, Neil Diamond and Simon & Garfunkel.

After '66, she decided it was time to be the main attraction herself and began to venture into the burlesque circuit. However, she wanted to take it further, as she dreamed of a much more explicit and even obscene show. So, when times changed and burlesque began to give way to stripping, Monica was at the forefront and always updated and innovated her act as it was better seen or allowed by society or even the law.

The theaters filled up for her shows, the audience loved her and came back for more and more.

She was nicknamed:

'The Sexiest of Them All.'

Her performances continued to increase and intensity, progressively brazen and excessive.

She went further than all the other girls of her time, because she was not afraid to carry out acts that the others did not dare.

Some thought she was insane, but she claimed not to be afraid of taking risks for her fans or ending up arrested.

One of the funniest stories told about her is, for example, the time she sat on the head of a fella and when she got up she had removed from his head his toupee with her female parts.

Or when she was arrested for standing upside down with a cigarette in her vagina while she was blowing smoke rings out of it.

There is also the story behind the line (I will never eat another hot dog again!), as in one of her acts, she used to throw hot dogs out of her pussy towards the audience.

She worked with all the strippers of the time and even with future directors, producers and porn stars. She remarried and had two daughters with an Italian gentleman.

She formed the band 'Monica Kennedy and The Family Jewels' publishing the album "Football Pete" and doing a small tour around New York.




All the theatres, taking advantage of her fame, began to show porn movies before their performances, so, in a way of protest, legend has it that one night he sprayed everyone in the front row with champagne and ended up sucking 79 cocks clean that night.

Her famous phrase was 'It's feeding time', which she used after covering her crotch in whipped cream and cherries, prompting the audience to come up on stage with her to interact. She sometimes had sex with up to 10 people from the audience in a single night.

Other girls and other establishments, seeing that Monica was getting away with it, began to copy her style. In the mid-70's, a young entrepreneur in the adult entertainment industry named Rod Swenson decided to go see Monica's show and was fascinated. The collaboration between the two was immediate, being successful for both parties.







As late as the mid-1980s, Monica was still working on the strip circuit. She married for third time and still wore her famous cowgirl outfit. On her shows, she still had occasional sex with the audience, but not always.

She disappeared from the stage and lived in retirement until the end of 2018, when she passed away.



WHAT THE SONG ABOUT

By now, I'm sure many of you already know that I love progressive rock, from its beginnings in the late sixties, in all its wide-ranging approaches, from the crazy and totally experimental to the consolidated and more rooted eighties pop; from the English classics (Yes, Genesis, King Crimson) to the most popular American ones (Boston, Kansas) and the Canadians, Rush, passing through the whole range of Italian progressive from the seventies (Banco del Mutuo Soccorso, Il Balletto di Bronzo, Premiata Forneria Marconi, Semiramis, Quella Vecchia Locanda), from the Japanese legacy of Bi Kyo Ran to Gonin-Ish. But I also really like Progressive Death Metal, like the Russians Hieronymus Bosch, my compatriots from Agora and many that I am just recently discovering and loving.

In the case of the American band Kansas, I must say, first of all, that I love them. Their vocal play, their lyrics, their expressiveness and their emotion are dazzling. Since I was a child, I have often come across some of their songs and I adopt them, even if only temporarily, but during said time, I listen to them tirelessly, finding them fascinating.



Such is the case of the song Belexes. Track number 4 of the band's first and eponymous album. Recorded between September and December of 1973. Produced by Wally Gold, who during his career composed several hits for Elvis Presley, Nat King Cole and Pat Boone.



The song was composed by Kerry Livgren, who would also write "Carry On Wayward Son" and "Dust in the Wind" and was a founding member, guitarist and keyboardist of Kansas from 1970 to 1984. The main voice is provided by Steve Walsh, the main vocalist of the band's classic stage lineup.



This is a song that induces action, leads to battle, it's like a good, inspirational and emotional speech before going to war. I've found that a lot of Kansas' songs have that effect. Like when someone gives us some really good advice and walks away, leaving us with the anticipation, with wanting to put what we just learned to some good use.

It's the kind of song that, when I happen to hear it by chance, I play it again as soon as it ends, at least a couple of times. I don't even remember listening to a full Kansas album that much, just 'Belexes'. I've always felt like it's a completely different song from the rest of the band's catalogue, even though it's completely

integrated into the visceral style of Kansas. Let's just say that it has a certain 'je ne sais quoi' that makes it unique and, in my humble opinion, elevates it far above all other Kansas' songs.

Kansas' music has left an indelible mark on the progressive rock landscape since their formation in 1970. Among their numerous compositions, "Belexes" stands out as an intriguing piece that combines deep lyrical elements with complex instrumentation.

This song reflects the group's ability to fuse catchy melodies with darker, more philosophical themes.



From the outset, "Belexes" captures the listener's attention with its distinctive guitar sound and sweeping rhythm.

The instrumentation is rich and varied, with prominent use of keyboards complementing the electric guitars, creating an almost ethereal atmosphere.

This musical approach is characteristic of Kansas, who often

incorporate elements of classical and folk music into their work, allowing them to explore a wide range of emotions and narratives.

One of the most fascinating aspects of "Belexes" is its ability to evoke complex emotions through its music and lyrics.

The combination of melancholic melodies and energetic riffs

creates a contrast that reflects the duality of the human condition. Kansas manages to capture the essence of internal struggle, where hope and despair coexist.

This balance is what makes the song so powerful and resonant.

The song has a complex structure, typical of the Kansas progressive style, with tempo changes and sections that vary in intensity. The instrumentation includes a combination of electric guitars, keyboards, and a heavy use of the rhythm section, giving it a very dynamic sound. Kerry Livgren's guitar and Robby Steinhardt's keyboards are especially prominent.

Steve Walsh's vocals are powerful and emotive, adding an extra layer of depth to the lyrics and melody.

The lyrics of "Belexes" are enigmatic and poetic, inviting personal interpretation. They reflect themes of searching and reflection.

The production of the album overall is very polished, allowing each instrument to shine and be heard clearly in the mix.



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Welcome, Sinister Minister! It's a pleasure to have you here. To start this ritual of questions, why don't you give our readers a personal introduction, and also tell us how "Midnight Massacre Theatre" came to be and what the theme of the show is?

Well, first, I want to say thank you, immensely, Maxy for this interview and inclusion in the Halloween issue of your badass publication! And it is a true pleasure to speak with you today!

The Midnight Massacre
Theatre is something
that I think was creeping
around in the dark corners
of my psyche since I was
very young, as was the

Minister. But it wasn't until The Halloween season of 2003 that they emerged from the shadows and onto your TV screens across the country and even, eventually...the World!

Basically, I had just left a band I had been in for a decade, we had come very very close to success, at the last minute, literally....an interior factor self-sabotaged and ruined the chance, so I made my departure and, in the weeks after, being in a rather dark place, my darker half emerged and the show was born! And that's the short version!

You have a rather strong and dominant personality. How can you maintain that energy, combine it with your sense of humor, and at the same time make sure that the audience feels involved and welcomed?

Well, although we occupy the same vessel...The Minister and I are very much a "Jekyll and Hyde" dynamic. People seem to pay attention to a guy in corpse paint and fangs, over well...me, ha-ha!

So, the sense of humor is always lurking there, I am, by nature quite Sarcastic and even more so amplified when he's in control... and I feel anyone attracted enough to watch the show will feel welcomed if they are like-minded, and if not, the Minister really doesn't mind offending a few folks.









You often use satire in your show. How do you decide which topics are relevant enough to be the subject of your irony, and how do you find the balance between funny and offensive?

My general rule is; If it's funny, put it in..... Sometimes world events just kinda squirm their way into my commentary...but then you've dated yourself, so in a year or 2 (or less even) that particular joke might not land as well if people have forgotten the incident, so I try 'n stay away from those, unless it's just too good to ignore.... Mostly, I just keep within the confines of the movie being showcased...using characters and circumstances to bounce off...

I took a lesson or 2 from MST3K for that!

In your experience, what is the most grotesque horror cliché that makes you laugh out loud? Is there a film or book that you simply cannot take seriously?

Well, there is one...the Child's Play, Chucky franchise... although there's some good actors involved, (Brad Douriff, Jennifer Tilly) I can't help but laugh at a Doll running around killing people.

And as far as a cliché, there's so many in Horror that are humorous...it's difficult to choose just one...ha-ha!

Throughout the history of horror cinema, what do you think has been the "bloodiest" evolution (story or character)?

Yes, by far the 'Terrifier' franchise, Art the Clown is really making a mark as the Slasher that's spilled the most blood and surpassed anyone's expectations on the gore level.

What is the most dense, bizarre, strange movie that you might not watch again?

There was one movie I watched many years ago....I can't even remember the name, and it wasn't even Horror, I don't think....but, it's like it was filmed backwards, so the characters were in a time loop or something and would run around to catch up with themselves, it was bizarre AF and literally was giving me a panic attack while watching it, so yeah....that's one I never care to see again....

And, the first time I watched "Street Trash" in the 80's, it made me feel rather sick, but I'm sure that was the intent...so, it worked! Ha-ha! I did re watch it a couple years ago and it was nowhere near as effective so, it was my less experienced self from the 80's apparently.

Vampires are said to be selective with their "prey" if you were one of them and if you could invite three metal legends, living or dead, to dinner, who would they be and what dark dish would you serve them?

Ahhhh...a fun question!
Well, I would most likely invite Ronnie James Dio,
I feel he'd appreciate
the esthetic....and
most likely Dani
Filth, that's a
scene I know
he'd appreciate!

However, I must confess that I'd just have to forgo the 3rd and invite you, Maxy....
You could honor me by being my Vampire Queen for the evening!

We would dine on the Hearts of 3 of my most mortal enemies!

Now, can't ya just picture that!}

Finally, with Halloween in sight, do you have any horror music or movie recommendations that you think every metalhead should enjoy to get into the spirit of the season? After all, a true metalhead should never be without their dose of horror!

Wow! Yes I can. I would be delighted. It would be like a sequel to this interview: Dinner with

the Vampire. Delicious!

Absolutely agree with that! And yes, of course, in the Metal realm, you can't go wrong with most Black Metal or The Misfits / Danzig also fit that bill!

But I also gravitate toward Nox Arcana, who do a beautiful dark, gothic ambient, clas-

sical style of haunting albums that are perfect for any Halloween Soiree'!

For Movies, I'll suggest The Subspecies Series from Full Moon Studios.

Wonderfully done Vampire movies that were filmed in Romania and are quite authentic! Despite being somewhat lower budget.

Annud of course, Halloween just can't be right without The Great Pumpkin! Hahaha!



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


